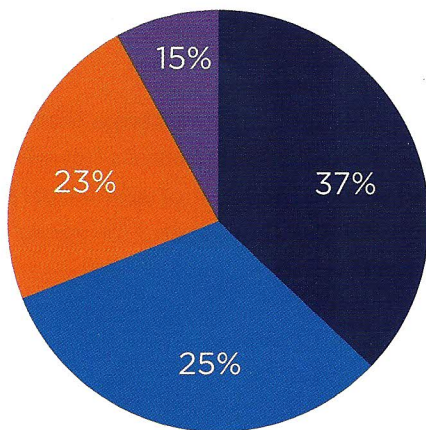

### Your AFS Tuition

AFS is a worldwide leader in nonprofit, international, high school student exchange with more than 60 years of experience in providing intercultural learning programs. Here is how AFS tuition is used:



#### Program Costs Abroad = 37%

- Host family recruitment • Screening of host families • AFS application processing
- Student placement • Orientation for students/families • Counseling for students/families
- Volunteer recruitment • Volunteer training • Volunteer support • Domestic travel to and from host family

#### International Travel and International Program Coordination = 25%

- International airfare and related costs • Ticket handling and processing
- Airport supervision and transfers • International secondary medical insurance
- Coordinating AFS international exchanges • Coordinating emergency response services
- Maintaining worldwide compliance with AFS program quality and operations standards

#### Program Costs in the U.S. = 23%

- Recruitment, screening, selection, and placement of students • Orientation for students/families • Counseling for students/families • Volunteer recruitment, training and support • Program and preparation materials • Host country information • Scholarships and support • Promotion of AFS programs to students, parents, schools, and community representatives

#### Compliance, Financial Management and Support = 15%

- Staff support for AFS programs • Information services • Compliance with quality standards of U.S. Government • Compliance with Council on Standards for International Educational Travel
